Salt didn't seem to help so almost in a devil-may-care spirit they sprinkled a little light brown sugar onto a frying patty. The result was tasty and tempting.

Frank began mulling over a new name for the new sandwich. He thought of Hamburgh, the German city this village was named after and its history as a city that raised and exported holstein cattle all over the world dating back to the 14th century. Perhaps the tinkling of cowbells he could hear were around the necks of grazing holsteins on nearby pastureland and maybe the beef he was cooking was from a holstein steer.

As Frank mused, Charles sold his first chopped beef sandwich. The customer said, "Gutte schmeck! Vas ist?" Frank no longer in doubt. "Hamburger," he replied, added, "das allerbeste!".

Thus was born and christened right here in Hamburg, New York, the hamburger which has become America's favorite sandwich.
