## Mir Space Station

In last month's newsletter, we had an article about the ease and excitement in starting out with satellite radio. Several members have recently experienced what we meant by monitoring the Mir Space Station.

Sergei Kirkalev U5MIR operates both voice and packet on 145.550 Mhz FM simplex. The equipment that you use for 2 meter voice or packet locally is able to listen to Mir and maybe even to contact them! On close passes, their signal can reach an S 9 to even a mobile unit.

It seems like magic to sit at your radio and suddenly hear a voice with a Russian accent speaking English (or sometimes Russian) to American hams. Of course, on HF this is old hat, but when was the last time you heard a Russian on your 2 meter radio, much less one who was in outer space?!

Frank WZ2J has made several voice contacts with the space station in recent weeks. He recommends that you call in a crisp manner, "U5MIR, this is Whiskey Zulu Two Juliette!" Of course, you should substitute your own call, or Frank will get credit for the contact and might be peeved that you are using his call!

Maling a contact with the space station on packet may be even easier than voice. Terry KM4XZ was surprised to not only copy packets coming down from Mir on his first try, but also to receive a disconnect message from the space station when he tried to connect to it. He was only using a I-pole antenna made from twin-lead hanging at a height of 7 feet in front of his apartment!

Two days later, Terry actually established a connect on packet with Mir from the club's Nike

## Stars e mrrl. Memberships

Membership in STARS is open to anyone with an interest in ainateur radio; an amateur radio license is not required.

Membership applications may be obtained from Frank Modzelewski WG2H, 1818 Clinton Street, Buffalo, NY 14206, from the newsletter editor or from board members.

Annual dues are payabie on January 1 and are $\$ 15$ for a single membership, $\$ 23$ for family memberships and \$8 for a student membership (through grade 12). The dues are pro-rated on a monthly basis for new members plus there is an initiation fee of $\$ 5$ when first applying to the club. For example, a new member joining in July would pay $\$ 7.50$ ( 6 months $\mathrm{X} \$ 1.25$ month) plus the $\$ 5.00$ initiation fee for a total of $\$ 12.50$.

Applications should be returned to Frank WG2H along with the approptrate "dues. The applications willoge teviewed and lowd by the Board of Directers at their business meeting. The applications are then voted on by the general membership at the next regular club meeting.

To monitor Mir, all you need tosknow is when it is passing overhead. This basically requires a satellite tracking program. The club has IBM compatible freeware/shareware programs which will do this which are available to be downloaded from a CD Rom. See the article on page 3 for more details on this. We will see if we can locate similar programs for the Apple and Commodore users in the club if there is interest.

## Coxaputer Programs

STARS has many shareware and public domain amateur radio related computer programs and files available for club member use. These are all for IBM compatible computers and are stored on a CD ROM. They can be downloaded onto $31 / 2$ inch and $51 / 4$ inch diskettes.


Areas covered include Morse code training, VEC exam practice, antennas, packet radio, DXCC and station logging, satellite tracking, QSL labels, propagation forecasting, frequency listings, RTTY/Amtor, traffic handling, Field Day, and much, much more.

Greg Young KE2YW has been taking care of this area. For the club. He can loan you a list of all the files so that you can make your selection. All that yon have to provide is a diskette, to hold the programs that you desire and $\$ 1$ per file to reimburse the club for expenses.
