STARS membership will hit 201 if all seven pending applications are approved at the club

meeting! We believe this makes STARS the largest amateur radio club in the Greater Buffalo area! It was only last fall that our newsletter bragged of a new club record of 158 members. Since then we have averaged seven new members a month!

What explains this great growth?

Well, there is little doubt that the new no-code Technician license has brought a new growth to the entire amateur radio area. The number of new licensees is up about 50% nationwide. STARS is very pleased to have added many newcomers to its membership.

On the other hand, probably 50% or more of our new members joined with General class or higher licenses. In fact, one of our "new" members has held an amateur radio license for 70 years!

One important factor that helps STARS attract new members is the fact that we view ourselves as a learning club. Therefore, we try to give everyone a chance to learn new skills and better operating procedures. This is why we allow everyone to participate in our activities, such as the up-coming Field Day, regardless of their experience level.

The great diversity of activities that STARS is involved in surely helps us attract many people.

STARS & ARRL Memberships

Membership in STARS is open to anyone with an interest in amateur radio; an amateur radio license is not required.

Membership applications may be obtained by sending a SASE to Frank Modzelewski WG2H, 1818 Clinton Street, Buffalo, NY 14206, from the newsletter editor or from board members.

Annual dues are payable on January 1 and are \$15 for a single membership, \$23 for family memberships and \$8 for a student membership (through grade 12). The dues are pro-rated on a monthly basis for new members plus there is an initiation fee of \$5 when first applying to the club. For example, a new member joining in July would pay \$7.50 (6 months X \$1.25/month) plus the \$5.00 initiation fee for a total of \$12.50.

Applications should be returned to Frank WG2H along with the appropriate dues. The applications will be reviewed and voted on by the Board of Directors at their business meeting. The applications are then voted on by the general membership at the next regular club meeting.

For those of you on packet, yes, KE2VW-5 has changed!! We are now running FBB software. When fully implemented, this will allow all users multiple actions not currently available on other Bulletin Board Systems. The software is one of the most advanced of it's kind available anywhere, and originated in Europe. Once the system is fully implemented. I will get copies of user instructions for dissemination. Features on the BBS include such things as: User Conferencing (where multiple users can enter the Conference Mode via the BBS); Multiple File Servers: and built-in satellite tracking programs, based on SYSOP identified satellites and the users exact location (assuming your latitude and longitude are entered into the BBS in degrees, minutes and seconds).

More will follow over the next few weeks.
