STARS and the Great Pumpkin!

STARS members joined with other amateur radio operators from WNY and across the state to assist the New York State Police in keeping Halloween safe for motorists on the New York Thruway in Operation Pumpkin Patrol.

Amateur radio operators watched 116 bridges over the Thruway (17 in Erie County) to report to the police anyone throwing objects off the bridges. They covered over 300 miles spanning between Albany to the east and Erie County to the west.

STARS member Ed Hollis N2NUN organized the efforts in Erie County and worked to come up with the volunteers in a short time frame.

STARS member Jay Lauder N2MHD arranged for the project to receive favorable publicity for amateur radio on Channel 4's early and late night news shows.

Our club's 147.09 repeater was used for local check-ins every half hour and then Ed communicated with state project leaders through a repeater east of Rochester.

STARS & ARRL Memberships

Membership in STARS is open to anyone with an interest in amateur radio; an amateur radio license is not required.

Membership applications may be obtained by sending a SASE to Frank Modzelewski WG2H, 1818 Clinton Street, Buffalo, NY 14206, from the newsletter editor or from board members.

Annual dues are payable on January 1 and are \$15 for a single membership, \$23 for family memberships and \$8 for a student membership (through grade 12). The dues are pro-rated on a monthly basis for new members plus there is an initiation fee of \$5 when first applying to the club. For example, a new member joining in July would pay \$7.50 (6 months X \$1.25/month) plus the \$5.00 initiation fee for a total of \$12.50.

Applications should be returned to Frank WG2H along with the appropriate dues. The applications will be reviewed and voted on by the Board of Directors at their business meeting. The applications are then voted on by the general membership at the next regular club meeting.
