On September 6 & 7, STARS members joined with other amateur radio operators from WNY, to provide radio communications for the Multiple Sclerosis (MS) Bike Tour.

This year's event started at a school near Clarence Center on Saturday morning. About half way through the course, the riders from Buffalo were joined by about 500 riders from the Rochester area for lunch. Then all of the riders continued on to Darien Lake Amusement Park for an evening of fun and rides. Sunday morning they returned to their start near Clarence Center.

STARS & ARRL Memberships

Membership in STARS is open to anyone with an interest in amateur radio. A license is not required. Membership applications may be obtained by sending a SASE to Judy Levan N2TEZ, 120 University Blvd., Depew, NY 14043, from the newsletter editor or from bard members.

Annual Dues are payable on January 1 and are \$21 for a single membership. \$27 for family membership and \$8 for a student membership (through grade 12). The dues are pro-rated on a monthly basis for new members plus there is an initiation fee of \$5 when first applying to the club. For example, a new member joining in July would pay \$10.50 (6 months X \$1.75 per month) plus the \$5 initiation fee for a total of \$15.50.

reviewed and voted on by the Board of Directors at the business meeting. The applications are then voted on by the general membership at the next regular club meeting.

Phase 3D Looking For A New Ride

Now that it's clear that the Phase 3D Amateur Radio satellite definitely will not be aboard the Ariane 502 rocket later this month, AMSAT has begun angling with the European Space Agency (ESA) for a new launch opportunity. It's also asking hams to hold their tongues.

This week, AMSAT made official what most observers had already figured out for themselves—that the Phase 3D payload would not be going up at month's end. In late July, AMSAT announced that it would have to structurally modify the Phase 3D opaceframe to bring it up to new mechanical standards made necessary by a late change in ESA launch environment specifications. But, making the changes put Phase 3D out of sync with the Ariane 502 launch schedule. As a result, ESA concluded that Phase 3D would not be able to fly on the Ariane 502 mission as initially hoped. The soon-to-be-completed structural changes also added 252,000 to Phase 3D's cost.

ESA's action did not go over well with some hams who posted what AMSAT called "several derogatory comments regarding ESA' on the AMSAT bulletin board. This week, AMSAT defended ESA against the critics and declared that ESA "has been very supportive of AMSAT for almost 20 years."

AMSAT pointed out that, while the first Phase 3 satellite "was a passenger on an Ariane vehicle which, unfortunately, ended in a launch failure in 1980," ESA has since "made amends" by using Ariane vehicles to launch AO-10, AO-13, the four Microasta and two UoSats, KO-23, KO-25, IO-26 and AO-27. AMSAT says it's in AMSAT's best interests that the Ariane 502 launch goes well "even without Phase 5D aboard."

Similar sentiments were expressed August 30 during a Phase 3D Program Board meeting at the Orlando Phase 3D Integration Lab. Participants in that meeting were Karl Meinzer, D142C, AMSAT-DL president and Phase 3D project leader, Werner Haas, D15KQ, AMSAT-DL vice president. Peter Guelzow, DB2OS, representing the Command Station Team; Ron Broadbent, G3AAJ, AMSAT-UK Secretary, Joel Harrison, W5ZN, ARRL vice president; Keith Baker, KB1SF, AMSAT-NA executive vice president; and Bill Tynan W3XO AMSAT-NA president.

The Program Board called on hams to "do everything we can to promote the successful launch of Phase 3D, particularly being especially careful of what we say on public forums such as AMSAT-BB or in letters to the editors of various magazines." Meinzer is continuing negotiations with ESA representatives regarding a launch vehicle for Phase 3D. The Board's statement stressed that "all of us should avoid doing anything that could possibly hinder" those talks.

JOTA '97

When Scouts want to meet young people from another country, they usually think of attending a World Jamboree. But few people realize that each year more than 400,000 Scouts and Guides "get together" over the airwaves for the annual Jamboree-on-the-Air (JOTA). Modern technology offers Scouts the exciting opportunity to make friends in other countries without leaving home.

JOTA is an annual event in which Boy and Girl Scouts and Guides from all over the world speak to each other by means of Amateur (ham) Radio. Scouting experiences are ex-



changed and ideas are shared via radio waves. Since 1958 when the first Jamborce-on-the-Air was held, millions of Scouts have met each other through this event. Many contacts made during JOTA have resulted in pen pals and links between Scout troops that have lasted many years.

With no restrictions on age or on the number of participants, and at little or no expense. JOTA allows Scouts to contact each other by ham radio. The radio stations are operated by licensed ham radio operators. Many Scouts and leaders hold licenses and have their own stations, but the majority participate in JOTA through stations operated by local radio clubs and individual radio amateurs. Some operators use television or computer-linked communications.

JOTA this year will be held on the week-end of October 18 and 19. Rick N2VZ is looking for some help to host some Scouts at STARS Nike Base Club Station. If you could help out, contact him at 941-3977. Some of our other members traditionally work with the Scouts in the field or at campores. We will try to get their stories for you.

JOTA doesn't have to be a big affair. If you know of any Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts, Brownies, etc., invite them over to your shack to let them talk to scouts in other parts of the country or the world. Just tune to the popular ham bands and look for someone calling "CQ JOTA" or get on and call yourself.
