STARS & ARRL Memberships

Membership in STARS is open to anyone with an interest in amateur radio. A license is not required. Membership applications may be obtained by sending a SASE to Judy Levan N2TEZ, 120 University Blvd., Depew, NY 14043, from the newsletter editor or from board members.

Annual Dues are payable on January 1 and are \$21 for a single membership, \$27 for family memberships and \$8 for a student membership (through grade 12). The dues are pro-rated on a monthly basis for new members plus there is an initiation fee of \$5 when first applying to the club. For example, a new member joining in July would pay \$10.50 (6 months X \$1.75 per month) plus the \$5 initiation fee for a total of \$15.50.



Applications should be returned to Judy N2TEZ along with the appropriate dues. The applications

will be reviewed and voted on by the Board of Directors at the business meeting. The applications are then voted on by the general membership at the next regular club meeting.

Time To Go

This will be my last column as your President, as of the end of the December meeting, Bob KA2WYE will then take over the job. In the next few paragraphs I give you a State of the Club from when I found it, to when I pass it on to Bob. I will state this, as the past President it is my job to assist the new President not act as a road block.

At the October 1998 Board meeting our treasury was at an all time low, very low. At the October 2001 Board meeting we had 5 times the money. Even with the membership down from past years. As the new President I took a look at the past spending and put a stop to it. Expenses like, misc repeater expenses from \$25 to \$40 a month, stamps, paper, printer cartridges. We now E Mail our newsletter The Telstar to many of you. This saves the Club a lot of money every year. This has made it possible for us to spend our money elsewhere.

Now let talk about where the savings went. Our Icom 735 HF radio, was ok but had problems. We had it look at locally, but it could not be repaired. Instead of throwing more money into it, we took a 2 year loan from a member and purchased Icom 765. Through cost cutting measures and by selling salvaged computer equipment we repaid that loan in a few months. We also fixed the trim on the Nike Base and painted it inside and out. The Town did take notice of our efforts and put a new roof on the building, at no cost to us.

Lets look back at Donations. With my contacts at work, I was able to get 3 pick-up truck loads of electronic stuff from my Employer. The better stuff we sold, most we gave away to local schools. It was reported to me the kids had great time tearing into them, cleaning and rebuilding them and getting them working again. Many less fortunate families in our area got their first computer from STARS, and for that we should be proud. We have also had a couple of equipment donations from the estates of SK's, which also helped out. We did have to put a stop on some donations, because of I did not want to turn our Club into a dumping ground for trash. Then once we ended up with it, we had to dispose of the trash, and I got tried of making midnight dumpster runs. Let alone the legal disposal problems.

THE REPEATER: This has been the most sensitive subject of my term as President. As a disclaimer, I believe that what was done to the repeater was the best job some people knew how to do. After I took office, I got a call from the Engineering at Channel 4. The new chief Engineer wanted "that mess in the corner cleaned up or get it out of here" that mess were our repeaters. Most of you saw the video that we took of before the rebuild, Those of you that have gone to
