
STARS continues to be one of the largest amateur radio

### STARS & ARRL Memberships

Membership in STARS is open to anyone with an interest in amateur radio. A license is not required. Membership applications may be obtained by sending a SASE to Judy Levan N2TEZ, 120 University Blvd., Depew, NY 14043, from the newsletter editor or from board members.

Annual Dues are payable on January 1 and are \$21 for a single membership, \$27 for family memberships and \$8 for a student membership (through grade 12). The dues are pro-rated on a monthly basis for new members plus there is an initiation fee of \$5 when first applying to the club. For example, a new member joining in July would pay \$10.50 (6 months X \$1.75 per month) plus the \$5 initiation fee for a total of \$15.50.



Members who are joining ARRL for the first time or who are renewing their membership after a lapse of two years or more should send their ARRL membership forms to Jack Cullum, Jr. KB2ESM, 6871 Webster Rd., Orchard Park, NY 14127 along with a check made out to STARS. ### Technician Class License Course


The Technician Class License Course being co-sponsored by STARS and ARATS is now in it's final stretch run.

### "The Tower Is Up!" NY Antenna Battle Finally Pays Off

A New York amateur who credits both the limited federal preemption PRB-1 and the ARRL with helping him win approval for an antenna support structure on his property, now reports his new tower is up. Fred Fitte, WA2MMX, spent months trying to gain the necessary approvals from the Town of Kinderhook. He saw his new tower become reality in late September--more than a year after his zoning battle began.

"I was finally able to erect my 50-foot self-supporting tower with the help of my local ham buddies who have supported me through the fight," Fitte said recently. Some VHF and UHF antennas already are up on the tower, and an HF tribander is in the offing.

The Town of Kinderhook would not allow a ham radio antenna support structure in excess of 35 feet without a variance. "PRB-1 is what saved my bacon," said Fitte. PRB-1, spelled out in the FCC Amateur Service rules under \$97.15(b), requires municipalities to "reasonably accommodate" amateur communication. Fitte finally got a building permit last May after what he called "a really ugly battle"--winning approval of his request to erect a 50-foot tower on a 3 to 1 vote of the town's Zoning Board of Appeals.

Among those who had helped Fitte in his battle with the town was ARRL Hudson Division Director Frank Fallon, N2FF, who says WA2MMX's situation "was not your run-



## CQ World Wide SSB DX Contest

The STARS Nike Base club station was active the week-end of October 25-27 as STARS members competed in the CQ World Wide SSB DX Contest, the biggest international SSB DX contest of the year.

The STARS team included Keith Patterson KC2DGC, Gerry Maira KA2MGE, Scott Barto KB2KOL, John Dilivio K2CF, Bruce Settlemyer KC2GJX, Jack Cullum, Jr. KB2ESM, Kevin Retzer K9KVN, Bob Mueller KC2JZE and Terry Rockhold K2OO.

STARS station performed great during the contest, and the STARS operators were told by many contacts that STARS had a good signal into their part of the world. That really picks up the spirits! The team was able to break through most pile -ups on the first or second try.



The team took advantage of the differing propagation properties of the bands from 10 meters to 160 meters to reach into all parts of the world. STARS team worked 70 countries on 10 meters, 65 on 15 meters, 74 on 20 meters, 14 on 40 meters, 12 on 80 meters and 2 on 160 meters.

Some of the countries worked included Niger, Senegal, Dem. Rep. of Congo (note - formerly known as Zaire), Morocco, Benin, Jordan, United Arab Emirates, South Shetland Islands, China, South Korea, Indonesia, Chatham Island, Beleau, Mariana Islands, Guam, East Kiribati, Ogasawara, South Cook Island and many, many others!

The STARS team's final score was 472,842 points (unofficially). A total of 540 QSO's were made over the weekend.

In total, 110 different DXCC countries were worked in 31 different CQ zones.

Why not come on out to the next contest and do a little operating yourself? The world is out there waiting to hear from you!

of-the-mill ham tower case." As Fallon explains it, Fitte ran into problems after he moved approximately 300 feet into a new development and filed for a building permit for a tower 10 feet shorter than his old one.

"His first hearing, only days before the 9/11 attack on the World Trade Center, did not go well," Fallon said, adding that Fitte "was shocked at the hostile response from his new neighbors."

What followed was a series of seven hearings over nine months, during which he confronted several hostile neighbors, aided by a local attorney and a medical doctor. The neighbors attacked the proposed support structure as a health and safety hazard and an aesthetic blight that would lower property values. Their attorney also wanted the town to require WA2MMX to move his antennas outside the development.

"Fred, with a lot of help from his friends, finally prevailed," Fallon said. Fitte and his wife, Terry, hosted a celebratory "thank you" picnic over the September Labor Day weekend for friends and expert witnesses who had helped. Only his attorney, Al Millus, WB2EQR, was unable to attend.

In addition to Fallon, among those who did turn out was ARRL Lab Supervisor Ed Hare, W1RFI, who voluntarily attended five of the hearings to present testimony. Dr George Wilner, K2ONP, the head of the Hematology Department at Albany Medical Center, attended one hearing session to debunk the issue of potential biomedical hazards. One friendly neighbor--a real estate appraiser--came forward to put to rest the claim that Fitte's antenna would lower property values.
