Hamburg Sno-Fest

The format for the Town of Hamburg's annual Sno-Fest will be changed this year. In past years, the Sno-Fest was a two-day winter festival of events held over a February weekend at the Nike Base. Last year the Sno-Fest was changed to a one-day event.

This year, the various winter indoor and outdoor opportunities of the Sno-Fest are going to be spread out over five days. The timing has been changed to Monday, February 21 to Friday, February 25 to correspond with the Presidents' Week vacation recognized by the local school districts.



The events will include daily public ice skating at the Hamburg Town arena, the annual "Mascot Hockey Game", various hockey skills competitions and contests, a snow sculpture contest, and new outdoor events conducted by the "Nature Adventure" organization.

STARS has traditionally had the club house open on the weekend to participate in the Sno-Fest even though public

participation has been limited. This year there will be no events on the weekend, so STARS has decided not to participate in the Sno-fest.

This month's club meeting will begin at 7 PM on Thursday, February 3 at the Hamburg Youth Center (corner of Prospect Ave. and Hawkins Ave.). All interested in amateur radio are invited; neither an amateur radio license nor club membership is required.

STARS & ARRL Memberships

Membership in STARS is open to anyone with an interest in amateur radio. A license is not required. Membership applications may be obtained by sending a SASE to Judy Levan N2TEZ, 120 University Blvd., Depew, NY 14043, from the newsletter editor or from board members.

Annual Dues are payable on January 1 and are \$21 for a single membership, \$27 for family memberships and \$8 for a student membership (through grade 12). The dues are pro-rated on a monthly basis for new members plus there is an initiation fee of \$5 when first applying to the club. For example, a new member joining in July would pay \$10.50 (6 months X \$1.75 per month) plus the \$5 initiation fee for a total of \$15.50.



Applications should be returned to Judy N2TEZ along with the appropriate dues. The applications will be reviewed and voted on by the Board of Directors at the business meeting. The applications are then voted on by the general membership at the next regular club meeting.

The historic 1945 talks brought together the "Big Three" Allied leaders--Great Britain's Prime Minister Winston Churchill, US President Franklin D. Roosevelt and Russia's Joseph Stalin--to discuss post-World War II reorganization of Europe. The conference's primary purpose was to reestablish the nations that had been conquered by Nazi Germany, and one result was the partitioning of Germany into US, Russian, British and French zones.

DXCC Listings Now Available on the ARRL Web Site

The ARRL Web site now features up-to-date listings of DXCC awards earned. The new system shows every issued DXCC award known to ARRL's computerized DXCC system, with the exception of individual standings for 5BDXCC. ARRL Membership Services Manager Wayne Mills, N7NG, says the Web site listing is even more complete than the DXCC Yearbook ever was, since the printed list did not list inactive band-accounts for the previous year.

"This will list everything and everybody," Mills emphasized. "The new system makes available a separate listing for each DXCC award type--band or mode." Even more important, Mills notes, is that it essentially renders obsolete the manually generated monthly and yearly reports. "Under the new system, DXCC listings will updated daily," he emphasized.

The DXCC standings of all ARRL members will remain in dark type. Call signs of non-members who have not submitted credits for 10 years or more are in grayed-out type.

Each listing by band or mode is complete in a separate Adobe PDF file. The largest listing (DXCC Mixed) now runs to more than 50 pages, but the size of the PDF file is only about 150 kbytes because of file compression. Printing format options include US letter-sized or ISO A4 paper.
