STARS & ARRL Memberships

Membership in STARS is open to anyone with an interest in amateur radio. A license is not required. Membership applications may be obtained by sending a SASE to Judy Levan N2TEZ, 120 University Blvd., Depew, NY 14043, from the newsletter editor or from board members.

Annual Dues are payable on January 1 and are \$21 for a single membership, \$27 for family memberships and \$8 for a student membership (through grade 12). The dues are pro-rated on a monthly basis for new members plus there is an initiation fee of \$5 when first applying to the club. For example, a new member joining in July would pay \$10.50 (6 months X \$1.75 per month) plus the \$5 initiation fee for a total of \$15.50.

Times are Changing at STARS



New Schedule for Question Pool Revisions

The National Conference for Volunteer Examiner Coordinators (NCVEC) has announced a new schedule for releasing revisions to the amateur radio examination question pools. The Question Pool Committee. (QPC) of the NCVEC has indicated that they believe that it is imperative to produce a new Technician Class question pool now to better position the Amateur Radio Service for growth in the years ahead.

The new schedule will impact the previously announced release dates for revision of all three question pools. The new Technician Class (Element 2) question pool is now due for release on January 1, 2006 and will become effective for examinations given on and after July 1, 2006. The previously announced effective date for the Technician

2005 ARRL Field Day Official Results

The ARRL has released the official results for the 2005 ARRL Field Day. Members of ARRL can view a searchable database of scores after logging in at their website at: www.arrl.org.

The scope of the event is truly huge (as one local car dealer would say)! A total of 2212 formal entries were received with 33, 078 people participating. These stations racked up 1.2 million contacts in the 24 hours! Due to lack of sunspots, the higher bands suffered from poor propagation. Total contacts for 2005 represented a decline of about 8% from 2004 and a decline of about 15% from the record established in 2002.

STARS WB2ELW station had an official score of 3,006 points from 749 total contacts by 32 participants. In the Western New York section, STARS placed 2nd out of 5 stations in the 2A category and 7th out of 35 stations in all categories. Nationwide, STARS placed 158th out of 454 stations in the 2A category and placed in the top 25% of stations in all categories.

Since STARS emphasizes using Field Day as a learning experience for all no matter what their experience level, this represents a fine effort for the club.



Class question pool had been July 1, 2007. The new General Class (Element 3) question pool, which had been scheduled to become effective on July 1, 2008, is now due for release on December 1, 2006, effective July 1, 2007. The new Extra Class (Element 4) question pool, which was originally scheduled for release in 2005, will now be released on December 1, 2007 and will become effective July 1, 2008. Barring any major rule changes, the subsequent updates to all question pools will follow the traditional four-year cycle.

ARRL 2005 Holiday Toy Drive Kicking into Gear

Toys already have begun showing up in Memphis, Tennessee, in response to the ARRL 2005 Holiday Toy Drive appeal. The League has partnered with The Salvation Army for this year's effort to brighten the holiday season for children in the coastal areas of Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana left homeless or displaced in the aftermath of hurricanes Katrina and Rita.

"As The Salvation Army continues to provide assistance to the victims of the largest natural disaster in modern US history, we are excited to partner with the ARRL in providing toys for children affected by hurricanes Katrina and Rita this holiday season," said Mark Jones, The Salvation Army's public relations director.

Because it still has the facilities to manage a large toy drive, The Salvation Army will handle the distribution end of the program. Its facility in Jackson, Mississippi, will coordinate distribution throughout the Gulf Coast region.

Country music artist Patty Loveless, KD4WUJ, is the Holiday Toy Drive's national chairperson.

The collection point for the toys is in Memphis, Tennessee, where the League has secured a warehouse facility. Between now and December 10, the ARRL is encouraging ham radio operators throughout the



US to purchase new, unwrapped toys for children ages 1 through 4 and send them with a QSL card to ARRL Toy Drive/The Salvation Army, 1775 Moriah Woods Blvd-Suite 12, Memphis, TN 38117-7125.

Volunteers in Memphis will sort and stock the toys, and in early December, the toys will be transported to The Salvation Army facilities in hurricane areas that need help the most at that time.

Amateur Radio volunteers turned out in force to support communication for relief and recovery operations in the


Nike Base Club Station Work Party

FCC Morse Code Proposal

The comment period on the FCC proposal to eliminate the Morse code requirement for all classes of amateur radio licenses closes on October 31 with more than 3200 comments filed with the FCC . People have until November 14 to file replies to comments filed previously by other people.

After this, the FCC staff will likely take some time to summarize the comments filed and report to the board. The ARRL has said that they believe that an FCC Report and Order ending the proceeding and announcing the effective date of any rule changes is not likely until sometime in 2006. The FCC could, of course, still decide not to make any changes to the rules.

Portions of Handbook on Emergency Telecommunications Now Available:


The International Telecommunication Union (ITU) has
