STARS & ARRL Memberships

Membership in STARS is open to anyone with an interest in amateur radio. A license is not required. Membership applications may be obtained by sending a SASE to Judy Levan N2TEZ, 120 University Blvd., Depew, NY 14043, from the newsletter editor or from board members.

Annual Dues are payable on January 1 and are \$21 for a single membership, \$27 for family memberships and \$8 for a student membership (through grade 12). The dues are pro-rated on a monthly basis for new members plus there is an initiation fee of \$5 when first applying to the club. For example, a new member joining in July would pay \$10.50 (6 months X \$1.75 per month) plus the \$5 initiation fee for a total of \$15.50.



Applications should be returned to Judy N2TEZ along with the appropriate dues. The applications

will be reviewed and voted on by the Board of Directors at the business meeting. The applications are then voted on by the general membership at the next regular club meeting.

2005 SKYWARN RECOGNITION DAY

The 2005 SKYWARN Recognition Day was held on December 3, 2005. This event is to celebrate the contributions that volunteer SKYWARN radio operators make to the National Weather Service (NWS). During the day, SKYWARN operators at 106 weather offices contacted other weather offices and other radio operators across the world.

SKYWARN operators manning the WX2BUF station at the Buffalo NWS office included STARS members John



KA2RFT, Mark N2LAB, Joe KC2HWC, Jay KF2JY, James W2CIA and Judy N2TEZ. They were joined by Bill WB8JPX, Luke N2GDU, Joe WV2NY, Bill KC2KTZ, Bill WB2AIV, Bill

KC2NWU, Jim KB2RPV, Tom KB2NCI, Bill WB2SXY and his wife Pam.

During the 24-hour event, they made 543 QSO's to hams in 46 states, including contacts with 60 other NWS offices. 
Terry K2OO activated the STARS Nike Base Club Station using the club's WB2ELW call sign. Limited to working only NWS stations, STARS made contact with 53 different NWS offices. STARS qualified for an F3 Tornado Certificate (see photo at right).

STARS club station operated great, and Terry received many compliments from the NWS stations that he worked such as "Great signal!" and "Your signal came right over the top of the other ones!" Some of the operators that he worked asked about Hamburg and Buffalo, or said that they came from WNY or had relatives here. Terry reversed this when he talked to Jose at the National Hurricane Center in Miami about his time living in West Kendall, FL.



2005 SRD Certificate awarded to STARS WB2ELW.




LARA Hamfest
