2006 ARRL Field Day Official Results

The ARRL has released the official results for the 2006 ARRL Field Day. Member of ARRL can view a searchable database of scores after logging into the website at www.arrl.org.

The numbers in 2006 again show that Field Day is one of the most popular on the air operating activity in amateur radio. An official total of 2169 entries were received from groups and individuals. Add to the 2169 an additional 30 checklogs and that brings the total received reports to 2199 - the third highest total ever for ARRL Field Day.

Those entries represented a reported total of 32,506 participants - the fourth highest total reported par-

The total number of QSOs completed during FD2006 was 1,236,825 - up slightly from 2005. There were slight increases reported on CW and Phone while digital contacts had 300 fewer completed Qs.

The STARS WB2ELW station had an official score of 2,878 points from 690 total contacts by 24 participants. In the Western New York Section, STARS placed 3rd out of the 5 stations in the 2A category and 8th out of 40 stations in al categories. Nationwide, STARS placed 167th out of 455 stations in the 2A category and placed in the top third of all stations in all categories.

STARS has always viewed Field Day as a learning experience for all...no matter what your expertise level. This year's numbers represent a fine job by those that participated.

STARS & ARRL Memberships

Membership in STARS is open to anyone with an interest in amateur radio. A license is not required. Membership applications may be downloaded from the club website or obtained by sending a SASE to Judy Levan N2TEZ, 120 University Blvd., Depew, NY 14043.

Annual dues are payable on January 1 and are \$21 for a single membership, \$27 for family memberships and \$8 for a student membership (through grade 12). The dues are pro-rated on a monthly basis for new members plus there is an initiation fee of \$5 when first applying to the club. For example, a new member joining in July would pay \$15.50 (6 months X \$1.75 per month plus the \$5 initiation fee).

Applications should be returned to Judy N2TEZ along with the appropriate dues. The applications will be reviewed and approved by the Board of Directors and then voted on by the general membership at the next regular club meeting.

"Omnibus" Amateur Radio Report and Order Takes Effect December 15

With publication in the Federal Register November 15, the long-awaited changes to the amateur rules are set to take effect 30 days later, at 12:01 AM EST December 15. The so-called "Omnibus" Amateur Radio proceeding, WT Docket 04-140, includes a significant expansion of the 75 meter phone band and a variety of other changes. The highlights:

- For Amateur Extra class licensees, the 75 meter phone band will start at 3600 kHz, while Advanced class licensees start at 3700 kHz and Generals at 3800 kHz. The high end of the CW/ RTTY/Digital band is now 3600 kHz (although CW is allowed on the entire band).
- On 40 meters, Amateur Extra and Advanced licensees will be able to operate phone beginning at 7125 kHz, while Generals start at 7175 kHz. The top end of the CW/RTTY/Digital band will be 7125 kHz
- (although CW is allowed on the entire band).
- There are no changes to the 20 meter band.
- On 15 meters, the General class phone band now starts at 21275
- kHz.
- On 10 meters, Novice and Technician Plus licensees can now operate CW/RTTY/Digital from 28000 kHz to 28300 kHz
- In addition, Novices and Tech Plus licensees can use CW only on the same frequencies as General and Advanced licensees on the 80, 40 and 15 meter bands: 3525 kHz-3600 kHz; 7025 kHz-7125 kHz and 21025 kHz-21200 kHz.

ister clarified two items that had raised some concerns when it was first released October 10: That the 80/75 meter band split applies to all three IARU Regions, and that FCC licensees in Region 2, which includes North America, can continue to use RTTY/data emissions in the 7075-7100 kHz band. Several controversial aspects of the proceeding are still to be resolved

The FCC has released an Erratum that corrects one error that inadvertently limited J2D emissions to an occupied bandwidth of 500 Hz. J2D emissions are data sent by modulating an SSB transmitter.
