HOUSTON REPRESENTATIVE INTRODUCES AMATEUR RADIO BILL IN CONGRESS

On Wednesday, April 29, Representative Sheila Jackson-Lee introduced HR 2160, the Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Enhancement Act of 2009 in the US House of Representatives. This bill, if passed, would "promote and encourage the valuable public service, disaster relief, and emergency communications provided on a volunteer basis by licensees of the Federal Communications Commission in the Amateur Radio Service, by undertaking a study of the uses of Amateur Radio for emergency and disaster relief communications, by identifying unnecessary or unreasonable impediments to the deployment of Amateur Radio emergency and disaster relief communications, and by making recommendations for relief of such unreasonable restrictions so as to expand the uses of Amateur Radio communications in Homeland Security planning and response." The bill has been referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce.

If enacted into law, HR 2160, would instruct the Secretary of Homeland Security to undertake a study and report its findings to Congress within 180 days. The study would spell out uses and capabilities of Amateur Radio communications in emergencies and disaster relief.

The study shall:

- Include recommendations for enhancements in the voluntary deployment of Amateur Radio licensees in disaster and emergency communications and disaster relief efforts.
- Include recommendations for improved integration of Amateur Radio operators in planning and in furtherance of the Department of Homeland Security initiatives.
- Identify unreasonable or unnecessary impediments to enhanced Amateur Radio communications -- such as

the effects of private land use regulations on residential antenna installations -- and make recommendations regarding such impediments.

Recommend whether Section 207 should be modified to prevent unreasonable private land use restrictions that impair the ability of amateurs to conduct, or prepare to conduct, emergency communications by means of effective outdoor antennas and support structures at reasonable heights and dimensions for the purpose in residential areas.

The Secretary of Homeland Security shall utilize the expertise of the ARRL and shall seek information from private and public sectors for the study.

The bill currently has five co-sponsors: Madeleine Bordallo (Guam), Mary Jo Kilroy (D-OH), Zoe Lofgren (D-CA), Blaine Luetkemeyer (R-MO) and Bennie Thompson (D-MS). Representative Thompson currently serves as Chairman of the Committee on Homeland Security. Representatives Jackson-Lee, Lofgren and Kilroy are members of that committee.

"We understand that Representative Jackson-Lee was very impressed with the radio amateurs she encountered on a visit to an Emergency Operations Center in Houston during Hurricane Ike last September," said ARRL Chief Executive Officer David Sumner, K1ZZ. "We are grateful to her and to the five original cosponsors for their support of Amateur Radio and the encouragement that their bill offers."

ANNUAL ARMED FORCES DAY CROSSBAND MILITARY/ AMATEUR RADIO COMMUNICATIONS TEST

The Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard are co-sponsoring the annual military/amateur radio communications tests in celebration of the 59th Anniversary of Armed Forces Day (AFD). Although the actual Armed Forces Day is celebrated on Saturday, May 16, 2009, the AFD Military/Amateur Crossband Communications Test will be conducted 09 May 2009 to prevent conflict with the Dayton Hamvention (15-17 May 2009), which is the same weekend as the actual Armed Forces Day.

The annual celebration features traditional military to amateur cross band communications SSB voice tests and copying the Secretary of Defense message via digital modes. These tests give Amateur Radio operators and Short Wave Listeners (SWL) an opportunity to demonstrate their individual technical skills, and to receive recognition from the Secretary of Defense and/or the appropriate military radio station for their proven expertise. QSL cards will be provided to those stations making contact with the military stations. Special commemorative certificates will be awarded to anyone who receives and copies the digital Armed Forces Day message from the Secretary of Defense.

All candidates should arrive by 9AM. Walk-ins will be allowed, but pre-registering will help speed up the processing the day of the test.

All candidates should bring the following to the test session:

- An original photo ID or two other original forms of ID, plus a photocopy of the ID(s) to be turned in to the examiners for their records.
- 2. Your current amateur radio license (if any) plus a photocopy of it.
- 3. The original copies of any applicable Certificate of Successful Completion of Examination (CSCE) plus a photocopy of each.
- 4. A test fee of \$14.00
- Your Social Security Number (SSN) or your FCC Federal Registration Number (FRN). Your application for a new or upgraded amateur radio license will be rejected by the FCC if you do not provide one of these numbers.

CENTRAL SQUARE TEACHER MAY TRAVEL IN SPACE

Jim Kuhl N2STK is a sixth-grade earth science students at Central Square Middle School. Kuhl brings his passion for both space and amateur radio to the classroom to provide unique lessons. As the radio club adviser, Kuhl stewards the district's amateur radio club, which has an impressive setup that he helped secure through an American Radio Relay League "Big Project" grant (www.arrl.org/FandES/tbp). He frequently facilitates radio communication between students and astronauts on the International Space Station and other space vehicles.

But Kuhl may soon experience space travel himself. As a finalist in the Teachers in Space Pathfinders program (www.teachers-in-space.org), Kuhl hopes to be one of the first educators in this new initiative to travel to space. If selected, he'll take part in his space mission and then return to the classroom to share his experiences first-hand in a framework that's meant to energize the enthusiasm of young people toward space and recruit more teachers.

Though Teachers in Space is a private venture, Kuhl has a distinguished relationship with NASA as a past "Educator Astronaut" candidate. He has attended NASA's Space Camp and taken part in various training exercises and space simulations.

The program is an "In Store" solution for customers to bring their old/unwanted (no matter where they were purchased) consumer electronics for recycling. Below are the answers to some questions (taken from the Best Buy website).

Why does Best Buy offer electronics recycling to customers? Consumer electronics are the fastest growing waste stream on the planet. As one of the world's largest retailer of electronics, we are in a unique position to help our customers. Best Buy is committed to making it easier for consumers to choose greener products, use energy for electronics and appliances more efficiently and provide appropriate end of life solutions for the products we sell.

What items does Best Buy accept at the store? Best Buy accepts most consumer electronics We also accept accessories such as keyboards, mice, remotes, etc.

What items are not accepted at the store? The following items cannot be accepted in-store through this program:

- Internal & External Computer Hard Drives.
 Before we accept your desktop or laptop computer for recycling, the hard drive will need to be removed.
- Console televisions or TV's with screens larger than 32 inches.
- Items containing Freon: air conditioners, dehumidifiers and mini-fridges. (Customers should contact their state/county sold waste department.)
- Appliances and microwaves.

Does Best Buy charge a fee for recycling electronics? Best Buy does not charge a fee for recycling most of the consumer electronic products. There is a charge of \$10.00 for TVs 32" and under, CRTs, monitors and laptops which is offset by a \$10.00 gift card. This charge does not apply to Best Buy private label products (i.e. Insignia, Dynex).

Are there any limits to the amount of electronics customers can bring in?

Customers are limited to bringing in 2 units per day per household.

What happens to products that are taken to the store to be recycled?

The products are removed from our stores through third party logistics, consolidated and then delivered directly to one of our contracted recycling partners. The recyclers will then determine if the product can be repaired, repurposed or recycled. Using various technologies our recyclers dismantle the electronics, separating out various commodities (Plastics, Glass, Metals, etc) which are repurposed into new products or delivered to a specialized recycler to be further processed and repurposed. The extent to which all of the commodities of any electronics can be recycled will depend on the composition of the unit. We partner directly with a short list of qualified, respected recycling companies who ensure all products collected for recycling through Best Buy are handled responsibly.

What happens to customer data included on a recycled product?

Best Buy stores will not take possession of customers' personal data- this includes, camera and computer discs/CDs/DVDs, hard drives from laptops or desktop PCs, or any other device that could contain customer information. Under no circumstances shall Best Buy be liable for any loss of any data or media from products delivered to us for recycling.

What other recycling programs does Best Buy have?

Currently, Best Buy offers the following recycling programs besides the in-store recycling program:

- Recycling Kiosks At the front of the store, accept ink cartridges, rechargeable batteries, cell phones, CDs, DVDs, PDAs/smart phones and gift cards.
- Appliance and TV Haul-Away Best Buy will remove an appliance or TV free of charge from a customer's home when a new product is purchased and delivered by Best Buy Home Delivery.
