



ME AND MY BIG MOUTH

I began teaching at the license preparation classes conducted by STARS about 2 year ago. Most recently, I was at the technician training program at the Seneca Nation. As we spoke about the certification exam at the end of the class, I told the students they would see every question possible before they took the test.

I told the class that in most multiple choice questions, you could rule out two choices as inappropriate. I also told them there were many Internet sites where they could take practice exams.

My original amateur license was earned in the 1970s. I upgraded twice, earning an advanced license. Not willing to learn code at any faster rate, I was content. Even after the code requirement was dropped from the extra license, I had no interest in upgrading.

Just before the 4th class session, I began to wonder what it was like to take a practice exam on the Internet. I entered the www.qrz.com site and began the extra exam. The process was easy. Each question provided immediate feedback as to whether or not I answered correctly. At the end of the exam, I found I had scored 62%. Wow! I had not studied any of the extra material, and I was only 6 questions shy of a passing score. With a little study, I could do this! Shortly thereafter, I opened my big mouth. At the class preceding the exam session, I asked the lead instructor if I could take the extra test when the

I began reading the ARRL extra license manual and continued taking the practice tests. By the time the test date arrived, scores on the practice tests ranged from 58 to 68%. I declined taking the test. (Foot in Mouth, Part 1!)

class took their technician test. He said, "Yes," and

the race was on.

Study continued, as did the practice tests. In two weeks, another test session was available. Four more

practice tests yielded only one passing score. I again declined the test. (Foot in Mouth, Part 2!)

However, my determination was set. More study ensued. Thereafter, I began passing the practice tests. Within 5 days, I was ready, scoring as high as 88%.

I checked the ARRL site for available exams. What luck! There was an upcoming test session in North Tonawanda. Furthermore, that test was scheduled for the evening, just right for a night owl who can't bear to get up early. If I didn't make this exam, the next available date was 3-4 weeks later. Since I felt I knew the material, I wanted to test ASAP. That would free me to enjoy the holiday period.

The test, sponsored by RAWNY, took place in the old Wurlitzer building. Of the five present, I was the only one testing for the extra ticket. I answered the questions I knew. If I got them all right, I would pass. I then returned to the more difficult questions. When done, I rechecked each question, and handed in the papers.

Eternity began. The first VE started marking the test. I knew that more than thirteen questions wrong would fail. I watched the VE's red felt marker as he lined up the answer key. One... Two... Three... Four... Five... Six... Seven... Eight.... That was it. The process was repeated by the other two VEs, with the same result. Paperwork was completed, and the lead VE said, "You passed."
