


WAYNE FLICK MADE AN HONORARY MEMBER

worked fine (I love the report-making part of that program). Unlike last year, all other equipment worked without problems. For sure, we have removed the 'poltergeist' from the club house.

Our county count was about the same as was our number states. So, in short, we made quality contacts this year, but not a lot. I think weather was rainy last year. This year's good weather may have had many hams outside doing fall chores, and not hamming.

The action was slow but steady. We were on the air for most of the 12 contest hours. Mostly, we called CQ. If no one comes back, you can't work them! The times we tried to "hunt and pounce" we found no one calling CQ. So maybe, with our score even lower than last year, we will do 'OK' in the listing with the others who submit logs. Time will tell. We did this for fun and to sharpen our operating skills; not to be first, even though we came in first in our class last year.

A noteworthy call worked was with former STARS President **Wayne Carpus**, **W2ZDP**, from his new home in North Carolina. Linda Jablonski, KC2YMM, worked some DX; GD4HWD and G7LWN (Great Britain).

We made 139 contacts. They included 34 of New York's 62 counties, 26 of the 50 States, and 2 of 9 Canadian provinces.

I have applied for a 1x1 call sign for next year's NYS QSO Party (October 19, 2013). I am hoping we will get 'N2E' as we had for this year. Next year (2013) the tower will be up with the 'HT-6' beam antenna. Also, the open wire 160 meter antenna will be up 40 or more feet higher. That should help rake in the QRP.

FEMA GRANT SOUGHT

STARS responded to a "Request for Proposals" from the Federal Emergency Management Administration. The proposals are for grants of up to \$35,000, for the purpose of increasing a community's ability to respond to natural and man-made disasters.

The **STARS** proposal would fund a mobile communications command post, to allow the establishment of amateur radio communications during the disruption of power and communications networks. The grant proposal was written by **Scott Barto**, **KB2KOL**.

Awards are expected to be announced in November.

In the 1970s, a serious injury was suffered by a truck driver on the NYS Thruway. It was Halloween, when youngsters dumped items over a bridge, striking the trucker.

The event was witnessed by a local resident. Thereafter, she spent each Halloween watching the bridge, to deter similar future acts.

The word spread and soon others began watching bridges on Halloween. Over the years, the NYS Police began coordinating the efforts. Amateur radio opera-

tors were recruited as bridge observers.

Today, amateur operators, under the direction of the State Police, are stationed on the Thruway bridges on



Halloween and the day before Halloween. In Erie County, amateurs come from the ARES/RACES team.

Linda Jablonski, KC2YMM, is this year's amateur net coordinator. She will be in constant radio contact with 8 volunteers each evening to keep our bridges safe. Additionally, an amateur radio (no transmit capability) will be installed in the car of the State Police coordinator.
