
WE GOOFED (NOT!)

SKYWARN TRAINING

What is **SKYWARN**?

SKYWARN is a volunteer network of persons willing to observe and report specific weather conditions to the National Weather Service. While radar provides an invaluable tool for monitoring weather conditions, human eyes can fill in the details that radar cannot display.

To become a **SKYWARN** volunteer, one must attend at least one training class every three years. **SKYWARN** volunteers are issued an identification card for use during serious weather conditions.

Amateur radio operators are valuable **SKYWARN** volunteers, as the National Weather Service often uses



amateur radio equipment to receive reports from field observers.
