#### WHAT'S UP?

The tower at the **STARS** radio clubhouse was lifted into place on Thursday, May 16th. With the pro bono assistance of <u>Contour Steel Products of Eden</u>, and its president, **Mark G. Patton**, a crane was provided to lift the tower into its new position. The crane was run by **Bob Page**, of Operating Engineers Union Local #17.

Once bolted in place, the worst nightmares of those working on the project came true. Despite extreme care in placing the base, the tower leaned to the west.

Thinking caps replaced hardhats, and the STARS members began a process to remedy the tilt. Shims were produced on site, and through the use of a hydraulic car jack, they were placed between the tower and its base until a plumb alignment was achieved.

STARS members present for the erection process included Conrad Barrick, KC2WRY; John Czuba, W2IV; Thomas Dean, KA2NXY; Robert Koster, KA2WYE; John Leitten, KA2RFT; Don Niles, K2PMC; and Ed Patton, N2ING.

Remaining tasks include installation of a beam antenna and connection of all the cables.

# DOLLYWOOD - AND A PLEASANT SURPRISE!

My fiancée, Wanda, wanted to go to someplace new for her birthday, so we decided on Pigeon Forge, Tennessee, home of **Dollywood**. We spent a pleasant two days there and then went to Gatlinburg. Both these locations are close to one other in the beautiful Smokey Mountains, and tourist traps to be sure, but taking in the scenery was beautiful and most of the folks visiting there were our age. This was, of course, "off season".

While browsing in one store, a clerk asked if I owned a radio station (I was wearing a shirt with my call sign on it). I replied, "Yes and no," thinking he was talking about a broadcast station, but he meant an amateur radio station. We had a nice chat. He wasn't a licensed ham, but had some interest and asked if I knew about the local ham radio manufacturer. After a quick second of thought, I replied Tennessee Technologies, Ten Tec. Of, course I knew of them, but didn't know where they were located. He informed me they were located in Sevierville, just seven miles from Pigeon Forge.

The next day we headed for **Ten Tec** for a visit. My hopes were to visit the showroom and operate some of the equipment in the nice "shack" set up for visitors. To my surprise, we were given a nice tour of the man-



ufacturing facility. In addition to making great amateur and commercial equipment, their machine shop makes molds, not only for their equipment, but for the automotive industry as well. They also do all of their

own silk screening. This keeps the shop busy all year, and keeps the facility open in slow times.

Almost all of the manufacturing is performed by computer controlled machines that populate the surface mount components on multi-layer printed circuit boards. There are, however, some components that have to be hand inserted and the wave soldered



I took quite a few pictures of the plant, with no restrictions; more than what would fit into this article. The testing and repair benches were quite impressive, any ham would love to have all or a portion of that test equipment. However, you'd need a separate building.

In the store I purchased a **Ten-Tec** coffee mug and a book about **Ten-Tec**'s founder, **Al Kahn**, **9BBI** and later **W8DUS**. The book chronicled **Al's** working life, businesses and notable friends, including **Knute Rockne** of Notre Dame Fame. It is interesting that **Knute** gave **Al** the inspiration for changing the name of his company to "**Electro-Voice**". How many of you older hams remember that name? The detail in the book is too much to write about here, but suffice it to say, that it is very interesting, to say the least.

So, if your vacation plans include the Smokey Mountains, consider a stop at the **Ten Tec** facility. You will see some of the only remaining American-made, amateur radio equipment.
