FIELD DAY SOON

The last full weekend of June will be June 27th and June 28th. As most experienced amateur radio operators know, that will be the time for Field Day. Field Day was developed as an exercise where amateurs could practice communications during adverse or emergency conditions.

STARS will hold their Field Day activities at the Nike Base Clubhouse, 2982 Lakeview Road, Hamburg. Officially, the event runs for 24 hours, from Saturday, 2:00 PM until Sunday, 2:00 PM. However, setup is always needed. Traditionally, **STARS** has used generators, batteries and solar cells for power. These power sources do need preparation. Amateurs are encouraged to come at noon for some of that work.

In recent weeks, there has been significant housekeeping activities at the clubhouse. It is expected that three stations will be operating.

Members and others are encouraged to come down for part of the 24 hour activities. Opportunities for radio operation and logging, will be plentiful.

Some members have expressed interest in operating CW (Morse Code). The station equipment has been set up to allow such transmissions.

By the way, if you are new to amateur radio, Field Day is one of the best opportunities to "get involved" in the hobby. You can operate, log, or just watch the others. In addition, you will be among a group of several experienced amateurs who will be delighted to impart some of their knowledge about the hobby.



AMATEUR RADIO PARITY ACT OF 2015

Representative Chris Collins mailed "campaign style" post cards to several amateurs in his district. While many would ignore such a card, others realized something wasn't right - there was no approaching election.

Upon reading the card, it became evident that it bore no relation to any election. It was a message to amateur radio operators about a bill in Congress to protect amateurs from excess restrictions as they used their land for amateur radio use.

Collins joined his colleagues as a cosponsor of the bill, H.R. 1301, the *Amateur Radio Purity Act of 2015*. The legislation would direct the FCC to redact unnecessary restrictions on amateur radio equipment, and prohibit restrictions on private land use for amateur radio communications. The hope is that by giving radio operators more freedom, they can continue to serve as vital resources to communities.

The bill has gained the support of the ARRL. A booth at the Rochester Hamfest will feature the proposal.

PROGRAMMING OF BAOFENG RADIOS

When I first received my *Baofeng* UV-5R radio from a **STARS** raffle, I was eager to enter appropriate frequencies for use in Western New York. I downloaded *Baofeng's* software, hooked up the radio with an appropriate cable, and the programming was easy.

Then, at some point, the software could no longer find the radio. That put an end to the easy programming. I had to learn the manual method from a poorly written translated instruction manual. Of course, by this time my frustration had reached exospheric levels. I cleared all versions of the programming and cable/software from my computer. Attempts at a new reload were unsuccessful. Slowly, I became aware that other amateurs were having the same problem.

Recently, I came upon a website with detailed information about the *Baofengs*. One item stressed was that the connecting cable had to have the correct software, and that this software was not the most up-to-date version. It mentioned how Windows 7 and beyond would automatically install software for the cable, and how this did not recognize the radio.

I loaded the proper driver and added the cable to the hardware list. However, in trying to find the *Baofeng* software, I could not get it to load. So, it was off to the **CHIRP** site for their programming software. Success! The software worked well, and recog-

nized the radio via the cable. I was back on line for programming the *Baofeng* by computer.

BAOFENG NOW POFUNG

The Chinese manufacturer of those popular and inexpensive radios has rebranded its name for the international markets. The current name '*BAOFENG*, a literal Pinyin translation of their Chinese character name, has been difficult for non-Chinese hobbyists to pronounce. Often heard were different kinds of pronunciations, like 'BAY-O-FENG'. The new name 'Pofung' is easier to pronounce and more friendly to customers, while maintaining the phonetic symbolism of the brand.

The new brand 'Pofung' will gradually replace the existing brand '*BAOFENG*' in the global markets outside China. The official web domain:

FCC SCRAPS AMATEUR RADIO VANITY CALL SIGN REGULATORY FEE

The ARRL reports that the FCC is eliminating the application fee for an Amateur Radio vanity call sign. The change will not go into effect, however, until required congressional notice has been given. This will take at least 90 days. As the Commission explained in a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, Report and Order, and Order (MD Docket 14-92 and others), released May 21, it's a matter of simple economics.

"The Commission spends more resources on processing the regulatory fees and issuing refunds than the amount of the regulatory fee payment," the FCC said. "As our costs now exceed the regulatory fee, we are eliminating this regulatory fee category." The current vanity call sign regulatory fee is \$21.40, the highest in several years. The FCC reported there were 11,500 "payment units" in FY 2014 and estimated that it would collect nearly \$246,100.

In its 2014 Notice of Proposed Rule Making (NPRM) regarding the assessment and collection of regulatory fees for FY 2014, the FCC had sought comment on eliminating several smaller regulatory fee categories, such as those for vanity call signs and GMRS. It concluded in the subsequent Report and Order (R&O) last summer, however, that it did not have "adequate support to determine whether the cost of recovery and burden on small entities outweighed the collected revenue or whether eliminating the fee would adversely affect the licensing process."


