CHARGE!

Your first batteries were probably carbon zinc one-time-only pieces that could not be recharged. They had a finite lifetime before replacement was necessary.

Next, you may have used alkaline batteries. Like the carbon zincs, they had a one-time-only life. However, they lasted longer than the carbon zincs.

Not as obvious to us, were the lead acid batteries common in cars. They were rechargeable. In fact, they could go through hundreds of recharging cycles before they bit the dust. However, they were heavy and cumbersome for portable use. If only a smaller version existed.

The smaller version probably first appeared as the nickel-cadmium battery. They could be recharged. However, disposal of lifeless nickel-cadmium batteries was viewed as difficult, as the materials in those batteries were considered toxic waste.

Improvements were discovered. The nickel-cadmiums were replaced by nickel-metal hydride batteries, better performers and not as dangerous to the environment.

More and more improved batteries came along. A notable version was the lithium-ion battery. It had a large recycle lifetime. However, some of those batteries had a tendency to swell, over their lifetime, deforming the radio cases that held them.

News picked up on the fact that many Galaxy Note 7 cell phones were exploding. In many cases, severe injuries, deaths, or significant fires were caused by these lithium-ion batteries.

The latest type of battery on the market is the lithium-iron phosphate.

FIRST AID!

A First Aid kit had been added to our radio shack at 2982 Lakeview Road. It hangs on the south wall of the north room, just to the right of the white board.

Its keyhole mounts hang on two screws. To take the kit off the wall, lift it up from the bottom, until the screw heads clear through the keyhole circles.

To open the kit, you must "unlock" it. This is done by sliding the locks on both sides of the handle toward their closest corner. Then the top of the case can be opened. The picture shows such a case. However, locks in the picture appear in red while the kit in the clubhouse has black locks.

TIME CHANGE COMING

On March 12th, at 2 AM, Daylight Saving Time will go into effect. That means clocks should be moved ahead one hour, to 3 AM. (Most people do this before going to bed on Saturday, March 11th.)


